Monarchy

In Art/Topic Hever 2 have been learning about 'Magnificent Monarchs.' The students used clay to create 2D models and used templates of past monarchs to help.





Hever classes 1 and 2 joined together this term to observe some animals in a pet shop. Their Science topic is 'Animals including humans', and the children were able to talk about the different animals that they had seen and they needed different environments to keep them alive. They understood that fish needed to live in water while other animals only lived on land. They also noticed that some of the animals needed special light and heat lamps in their environments.

The students at the Hub have been working really hard this half term. They have been making a 'Lasagne bed' which is a way to make our own compost for growing vegetables and flowers.

The students layered compostable materials like newspaper, cardboard, leaves, and grass clippings and used straw from Curly's Farm. By the spring, worms and microorganisms will have decomposed the materials and mean it would have changed into a rich, nutrient-dense soil of its own.



At the Hub, some of the students have been studying Buddhism in their PSHE lessons. As part of this, a Tibetan Monk came along to speak to the students. Students gave him a basket of food to thank him for coming.

This term, Dylan has been learning some carpentry skills during his construction lessons. Here he is making made a knight on a horse. Great work Dylan!











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




It has been an exciting term for the Music department.
