





Santa in the city by Tiffany D. Jackson & Reggie Brown


A little girl's belief in Santa is restored in this ode to the magic of Christmas.








Lost and found by Oliver Jeffers

But when they get there, the boy discovers that maybe home wasn't what the penguin was looking for after all.




One snowy night by Nick Butterworth


Holidays from other faiths and cultures celebrated in December





Spin the dreidel! Eat some latkes! Learn all about why people celebrate Hanukkah through bright illustrations, recall questions, and charming text.


