



Enrichment

Enrichment sessions are group activities and clubs set up for pupils to enable them to socialise outside of their own class groups to experience, participate and interact with others. Enrichment activities aim to help develop and reinforce social, communication and life skills across all developmental stages within school. Each department organises suitable activities for their students at least twice each week before the end of the school day.

Enrichment clubs include turn taking games, fine motor activities (e.g. play dough), sensory play, karaoke, art, crafts, hair and beauty, table top games (e.g. pool, table tennis and table football), video games. Enrichment clubs also includes football club. Students practise gross motor skills, play football matches and even compete against other special needs schools at a local level.
